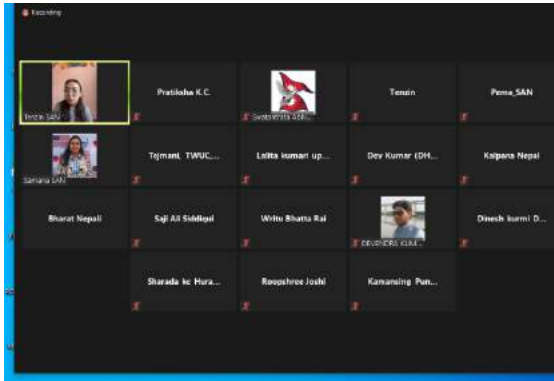

Capacity building of CSOs on developing Policy Brief on Child Labor

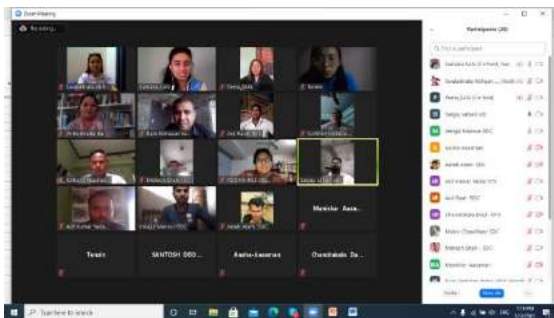


Swatantrata Abhiyan Nepal organized Policy Brief Presentation of 15 Sakriya PNGOs of Bagmati Province, Lumbini Province and Province 2 on 19th May, 24th and 25th May 2021 respectively through zoom application. A total of 38 participants from 15 PNGOs, SAN and World Education attended the event. The

objective of the event was to present policy brief on child labor prepared by the organizations according to their research findings for further intervention and advocacy in their working municipalities.

The event was facilitated by Ms. Tenzin Keyzom, Jr. Program Officer, SAN. The PNGOs from Bagmati Province, Lumbini Province and Province 2 presented their policy brief on Child Labor among the participants. Ms. Writu Bhatta Rai, Office In Charge, SAN provided suggestions on the presented policy brief. After incorporating the feedback and suggestions, the policy brief shall be submitted to concern municipalities by the PNGOs for further advocacy.

Data Analysis and Report Writing Training

The objective of the training was to enhance the skills and knowledge of PNGOs on data analysis, report writing and preparing a draft of policy brief.

group activity. As a way forward, 15 PNGOs of Bagmati, Lumbini province and Province 2 shall develop policy brief on Child Labor and share with SAN. The events ended with vote of thanks from Ms. Writu Bhatta Rai and Ms. Roopshree Joshi, Project Director, World Education.

Local Government Leaders Orientation and Interaction on Child Labor Free Campaign



Swatantrata Abhiyan Nepal in coordination with District Coordination Committee, Lalitpur organized orientation to Deputy Mayors and staffs of Lalitpur on 27th January 2021 at DCC Lalitpur Hall.

The objective of the event was to orient the Deputy Mayors on the regulation developed by MOLESS on child labor free local level. There was representation of five Deputy Mayors together with head of social development division. Mr. Sujan Jojju, Under Secretary of MOLESS provided the orientation on the policies and regulations for child labor free local level. Deputy Mayors committed to work on declaring their respective municipalities as child labor free.

Capacity Assessment and mentoring Partner NGOs on Child Labor Research



The five days Capacity Assessment and M&E workshop was organized by World Education in the month of February and April 2021 with 15 partner organization of Province 2, Bagmati Province and Lumbini Province. The team of consortium partners; World Education

(WE), Swatantrata Abhiyan Nepal (SAN), Terre des hommes (Tdh) and Antenna Foundation Nepal (AFN) conducted midline capacity assessment during the period. During the Capacity Assessment and M&E Workshop, SAN also conducted a mentoring session to the partner organizations where SAN team provided mentoring to each organization on Logic Model and Ethical consideration while

conducting research. Furthermore, to enable CSOs skills and knowledge on CBAR Survey and Case Study Research, and to identify and address the problems faced by partner NGOs on CBAR Survey and Case Study, SAN visited MANK, Sindhupalchowk, Prayas Nepal Dhading and CDS, Kathmandu and provided mentoring to 3 partners of Bagmati province.

TV Talk Show on the Role of Government to Eliminate Child Labor



SAN in together with NCPA and Global March conducted Television Talk program on “Role of Local Government to Eliminate Child Labor” and broadcasted on 9th March, 2021 on NTV plus. Ms. Parbati Rana, Vice-chairperson,

Ms. Sarita Dahal, Vice-chairperson of District Coordination Committee of Kathmandu committed to organize dialogue among the municipality within Kathmandu district on campaign against child labor with regular follow up and facilitation action from DCC.

Rights of Domestic Workers

Leadership for Change Training to Domestic Workers



22 domestic workers got training on Leadership for Change on 20 March 2021 at Alfa Hose Baneshwor. The main aim of the training was to orient domestic workers

on legal provisions and process of Domestic Workers, Local government's policy and programs, opportunity and plans for domestic workers and challenges of domestic workers. The trained domestic workers committed to work for the right of domestic workers including social security and registration of domestic workers in the municipalities.

Social Media Campaign on Domestic Work, and Forced Labour

SAN has initiated Social Media Campaign on Domestic Work, Child Labor and Forced Labor since January 2021. From January 2021-May 2021 SAN collected and edited video recordings of 15 influential personalities on the rights and issues of Domestic Worker, Child Labor and Forced labor. 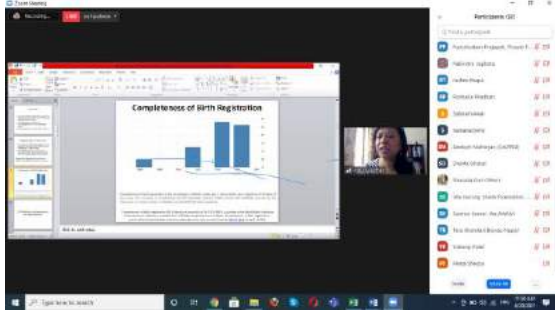
Interaction on Vital Registration of Children born from Returnee Migrant Women Workers

to aware government representatives on Female migrant workers and their children denial of vital registration and discuss on possible ways to address the issue. Altogether 31 participants from government, Shelter Network, Hamro Samman Shelter partners, Legal partners, technical partners and Winrock International participated in the event. Ms. Indu Tuladhar, Advocate shared presentation on legal provisions on Birth Registration of Children, Gaps in implementation of the laws; challenges faced by returnee women migrant workers

and human trafficking survivors to get the birth registration of children with recommendations.

Ms. Charimaya Tamang, Chairperson, Shakti Shamuha shared the case on denial of birth registration of children from unwanted pregnancies. Mr Yubaraj Kattel, Director, Department of National ID and Civil Registration shared about the mandate of civil registration that is to register vital events such as birth, marriage and death of individuals. Ms. Namuna Bhusal, Program Manager, National Child Rights Council stated NCRC has facilitated in birth registration of street children. As a way forward, it was decided to develop common position among HS partners and civil society to advocate for vital registration of children from unwanted pregnancy for delegation to Department of National ID and Civil Registration.

Training for Network of CTIP Champions at Local Level “Leadership for Change on Countering Trafficking in Person”



Swatantrata Abhiyan Nepal in support of Hamro Samman Project conducted refresher training on “Leadership for Change on Countering Trafficking in

Persons” from January to March 2021 in Bagmati, Lumbini and Sudurpaschim Province. The training aimed to support CTIP Champions on responding to the challenges faced during Local Interventions. A total of 49 (44 Female and 5 Male) CTIP Champions were trained on the governance structure, advocacy issues, local government intervention, roles, responsibilities, facilitation skills and engagement with the Local Government.

To train the CTIP champions, the facilitator used participatory approach with various group activities. During the training period, the CTIP champions developed 101 action plans to for local intervention. The developed action plan is focused on awareness campaign for schools children's, youth, local group, victims, survivors and returnee migrants on accessing free health services, countering human trafficking, gender and

domestic violence at local level, initiating the formation of LCCHT and WCCHT at local level, interaction with the local government leaders on countering human trafficking, data collection, visiting municipalities and ward offices for coordination, collaboration and access to government opportunities at local level. The LFC graduates committed to implement the planned activities within a timeframe of one year

Development of Advocacy and Communication Plan



Swatantrata Abhiyan Nepal provided technical assistance to Biswas Nepal and Shakti Samuha to develop advocacy and communication plan on 25-26 January 2021 at Alfa House Banquet and on 5-6 April 2021 at Siddhartha Foodland, Old Baneshwor, Kathmandu respectively. The objectives of the workshop was to identify

the advocacy agenda for developing advocacy and communication plan of Biswas Nepal and Shakti Samuha. Ms. Writu Bhatta Rai, Office In Charge, SAN and Resource Person JP Sapkota facilitated the 2 day's workshop. Through group works and discussion, the team identified advocacy agenda and issues, existing policy, the problems that policy has not or not able to address and what should be in the policy system for planning. After finalization of advocacy issues by Biswas Nepal and Shakti Samuha, SAN in support of resource person developed Advocacy and Communication Plan of Biswas Nepal, Nepal and Shakti Samuha.

Campaign on Child Protection

Provincial Dialogue on Child Protection and Child Care Management in Health Institutions in Emergency Situation



National Child Protection Alliance (NCPA) together with Nepal Paediatric Association (NEPAS), Swatantrata Abhiyan Nepal (SAN) and Paediatric Nursing Association of Nepal (PNAN) jointly organized “Provincial Dialogue on Child Protection and Child Case Management at Health Institution in Emergency Situation” in Bagmati Province on 22nd May, 2021 via Zoom. The main objective of the event was to explore the current scenario of child rights violation during the second wave of COVID19 and to educate the health care practitioners and child Rights activists on child protection and child care management in Health Institution in emergency situation. There were 100 participants from different child based organizations, Network, NGOs/INGOs along with representatives

of different health institutions/associations, Doctors and Nurses.

The program was chaired by Ms. Writu Bhatta Rai, chairperson, NCPA and moderated by secretary of NCPA Mr. Prakash Khatiwoda.

Dr. Ram Hari Chapagain gave presentation on the condition of child care management in Nepal along with the data of infected rate of children from Covid-19. Moreover, Dr. Deepak Upadhyay, Consultant Pediatrician North Cumbria Integrated Care, UK presented on “Impact of Covid-19 on Child Protection /Child safeguarding” and Mr. Keshab Chalisey representing National Child Rights Council (NCRC) presented on the topic Child Protection in Emergency and its Response by Government. He highlighted the probable effect of COVID on children and the works carried out by NCRC in the protection of children. The chairperson of PNAN, Ms. Apsara Pandey delivered the vote of thanks to all the Presenters, guests and participants and stated that construction of child friendly hospitals, ICU Beds, Isolation wards is essential and they are ready to help the government to involve in child friendly treatment.

Civil Society Recommendations on National Plan of Action

(2078-2087)

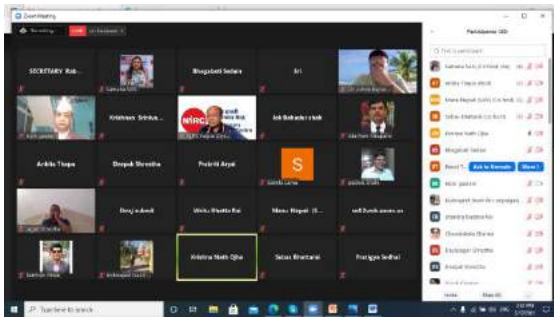


SAN in coordination with NCPA conducted consultation program on providing suggestions on protection of children for National Plan of Action 2078-2087. There was representation of 30 participants from NCPA Board members, Child Right Networks, and INGOs. The participants provided suggestions on the National Plan of Action related to Children. The suggestions submitted to the

executive director of NCRC, Mr. Milan Dharel for further action. The major suggestions are: Ensuring the right of every child to free health care, nutrition and immunization, to implement and ensure the right of all children of Nepal to get birth registration and citizenship as well as the right to free and compulsory education up to basic level, to provide child protection in order to reduce the risk of safe movement of children, trafficking and child labor during disaster and initiate and coordinate public audits of programs, achievements and expenditures on children made by the three-tier government every year.

Road Safety

High level interaction program on speed management and road safety laws



On the occasion of 6th UN Global Road Safety week, Swatantrata Abhiyan Nepal and Nepal Automobiles Association (NASA) organized “High level interaction program on speed management and road safety laws” on 17th May 2021 through Zoom application. The Objective of the event was to seek commitment from the policy makers for implementation or enforcement of 30km/h limits in urban

areas especially in school and hospital areas. A total of 60 participants from different National and International organizations, Parliamentarians, road safety laws experts, Ministry of Infrastructures participated in the program. The program was chaired by Chairperson of SAN, Prof. Chandrakala Sharma and moderated by Ms. Manu Nepali, Program Officer, SAN.

Ms. Bhagabati Sedai, Coordinator, NASA foundation stated that about 650,000 people are estimated to die annually in the road crashes because of speeding and everyone need to commit to maintain the speed of vehicles from individual level to reduce the number of death from road traffic crashes. Furthermore, Mr. Rabindra

Nath Shrestha, Secretary, Ministry of Physical Infrastructure and Transport said that not only ministry but if every individual along with hospitals, schools, universities and civil society organizations get united we can surely reduce the number of deaths due to road traffic crashes. He also highlighted the plan and works made by ministry of physical infrastructure and transport, for safer road construction and road management. Hon. Rangamati Sahi, Member of House of

Representatives focused on effective implementation of those laws and policies. The other representatives also provided suggestions and opinion regarding road safety and speed management. As a way forward, Ms. Writu Bhatta Rai, SAN stated that it is the state's responsibility to ensure the right of individual and to enforce the laws and policies. Similarly, private sectors should also be made responsible for speed management.

Complaint on Hello Sarkar on Speed Management

Swatantrata Abhiyan Nepal filed complaint in Hello Sarkar on 20 May 2021. The objective of filing complaint on "Hello Sarkar" was to bring in attention of government on impact created due to lack of speed management and importance to address it for safer streets and life. The complaint was filed through email to

official email address of Government of Nepal, Office of the Prime Minister and Council of Ministers. Filing Complaint in. "Hello Sarkar" is a system for redressed of complaints based on Information Communication Technology of the Nepal Government & OPMCM (Office of the Prime Minister and Council of Ministers).
